This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students achieving National Minimum Standards (NMS) in NAPLAN to 100% in Reading and Writing in Year 3 and Year 5.
(Benchmark: 2018 NMS Y3- R94.7%, W94.7%; 2018 NMS Y5- W95.2%)
- Increase the number of students in the Upper 2 Bands (U2B) to 40% Writing and Spelling in Year 5.
(Benchmark: 2018 U2B- W0%, S33.3%)
- Increase the percentage of students achieving \geq B to 60% in English.
(Benchmark: 2018 Semester 2: 49.3%)

Our initiatives include

- Implementing and embedding schoolwide pedagogical framework across all curriculum areas.
- Ensuring consistency in the teaching of reading, spelling and writing through the implementation of the Magnetic Island State School Teaching and Learning Handbook
- Investing in a Literacy Coach to support best first practice teaching in the areas of reading, spelling and writing.
