At this stage, Parent Teacher Interviews will continue to take place tomorrow afternoon but we will move to the undercover area, ensuring physical distancing and hygiene measures are adhered to. If there are any changes we will endeavour to let you know via email and social media.

They have had plenty of fun showing off their artistic talents with creating their creatures, and are currently completing their HASS research project, showing their understanding of how the Gold Rush affected colonial Australians.

Last week provided an excellent learning opportunity leading up to this research task, as the class were lucky enough to visit the Gold mining capital of North Queensland- Charters Towers!

After enduring two and half hours of travel, we began our day at the Infor-

mation Centre where students learned some fascinating history related to the area. We then moved onto the Zara Clarke museum, a fantastic little place, displaying what life was like during the Gold Rush era. A group of volunteers had an abundance of local historical knowledge to share with us, and enthusiastically guided us around this 'mustsee' museum. After a lunch break at Centenary Park, we enjoyed a tour through the Venus Battery, where approximately 90 tonne of rock was crushed per day in a rustic shed, in order to extract the gold from the Earth. The heat and noise alone, gave the students a taste of how tough the workers had it during this era. Our final stop brought us back to the exciting side of

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Year 6

What a busy term we've had! It's been both rewarding and exciting to see how the children have risen to the challenges and lifted the standards of their work, with a view to preparing for high school in the not-too-distant future. Thanks sincerely to all parents for your support throughout term 1.

Children have completed their English assessment, and we had some engaging and entertaining short stories presented. A number of the children began with a quite basic text, but with advice and encouragement, they produced a text that is more complex and more effective at achieving its goals. The skills developed through this task will continue to be explored and extended through the rest of the year. We have had some great improvement in both use of strategies and accuracy of work in Maths. Children are looking for logical connections between ideas, and are using reminders and memory triggers to choose appropriate strategies when working through multi-step problem solving situations. We will continue to work on memorisation and recall strategies as we extend on the work of first term and explore more complex Maths concepts.

Last week students presented their House Captains nominations speeches. I was both very proud and very impressed by the speeches written by the children, and by their enthusiasm and bravery in presenting in front of house groups. Teachers from each house group mentioned to

me how impressed they were with the standard of nominations speeches and with the confidence demonstrated by the speakers. Please congratulate your child for their efforts on this activity. It's very important that children <u>recognise for</u> <u>themselves</u> the positive aspects of this public speaking opportunity. They need to be able to congratulate themselves on a job well done, and understand that they have not 'failed' if they were not elected to the captain's position. Hopefully they can use this opportunity to provide feedback and encouragement for future similar activities.
