Principal's Report

Hi everyone,

Thank you all for your kind support over the last couple of weeks. As you can imagine, it has been a tough time for our staff, losing our good friend and admired colleague, Mrs Sharon Jupp. Sharon was such an integral part of our staff group and we will all miss her. Sharon was an inspirational classroom teacher, whose passion for literacy was infectious. In her role as Literacy Coach she inspired us all to become better (and not boring!) writers. Sharon was also passionate about working in our school kitchen garden and sharing her knowledge and enthusiasm with us. As always, we are doing everything we can to support staff and students though this very sad time. Please let me know if you feel that your child would benefit from extra support.

Over the next two weeks, our Year 3 and 5 students will be participating in NAPLAN Online. NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students have learned through their regular school curriculum. One of the main benefits of NAPLAN Online is tailored (or adaptive) testing, in which the test presents questions of higher or lower complexity depending on a student's performance. Tailored (or adaptive) testing is designed to assess a wider range of student abilities and to measure student achievement more precisely.

You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply do their best, just like they do every day at school. Teachers have familiarised the stu-

dents with the types of questions in the tests and the students have worked with the online platform during the last few weeks. Good luck to our Year 3 and 5 students. I know that you will do a great job and I am already very proud of you. You can see the types of questions and related functionalities available in the NAPLAN Online assessment at http://nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site.




Garden News

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Year 4 had some FUN with FORCES this fortnight! The class has had some interesting lessons and thoughtful conversations about this topic. They have learned that there are many types of forces acting on objects, to make them move, and even to keep them still! Did you know, there is more than one force acting on an object that is resting on the ground? Gravity is the force, created by the Earth's magnetic field, which pulls all objects towards the centre of Earth. This means the object is being 'pulled' towards the ground by gravity, whilst at the same time, Normal force is acting in the opposite direction, to make sure the object does not keep falling. Year 4

learned about Newton's laws of physics, and then tested some of his theories by participating in some fun experiments.

Also, this week, we went out to the school garden to prepare the Year 4 plot for planting. Some students helped weed and clean up the area, and others began planting seeds in seedling pots, in preparation for planting the seedlings for the 'whole school planting' day. We chose the plants our class will be growing, and discussed where best to plant them. Cucumber and snow peas are good climber plants, so the class decided to plant them next to the trellis wall, so they have a good chance of surviving. We will then plant some dwarf beans

and capsicum at the front of the plot. Lincoln's family also contributed, by donating some garlic chive plants to add in. We will put them in the centre. We can not wait to get our garden growing so that we can enjoy our delicious harvest!

In Maths we have continued to explore factors and multiples, number patterns, and both division and subtraction operations. We extended our work in each of these operations, and when children

We also revisited and extended some of our work from earlier in the year in HASS, Science and Art. We have further work to do in each of these areas, and so will gradually build understanding and knowledge of tasks as we focus on assessment activities.
